"I just love attending this committee!" How often do you hear that remark? But it's how members of the GC Women's Scholarship Committee feel about the joy and inspiration of awarding scholarships to outstanding college women ground the world.



79 Winners

This January, scholarships were awarded to 79 talented women, from 26 countries, including Sierra Leone, Ukraine, Papua New Guinea, Burundi, and Hong Kong.

In Burundi, Joselyne, an excellent student, helped produce a new radio program for the church FM station. She is treasurer of the Adventist Student Association at the university and served as youth leader and choir director

at church. Joselyne faces major financial challenges because her parents are very angry and

they refuse to help her since she became an Adventist.

She is but one of the many talented Adventist women who, facing great obstacles, are determined to get an education.

19 years; 105 countries

The GC WM Women's Scholarship Program has helped Adventist women since 1991, with a total of 1,456 scholarships to women in colleges in 105 countries. It is funded by royalties from the yearly women's devotional book, fund-raising activities, and donors.

Special Gifts to Solusi and Myanmar

Students at Solusi University in Zimbabwe and at Myanmar Union Adventist Seminary were especially blessed by your generous gifts which



totaled \$5,000 in special funds for these two schools, both of which face severe hardships.

Help for Solusi

At Solusi, eleven women were given scholarships. These are for majors including Accounting, Religion, and Family/Consumer Science.

Eulet is a mother of four. Zimbabwe's runaway inflation makes it impossible for her husband to care for the children's needs and pay her tuition, but Eulet is determined to graduate.

In Myanmar, scholarships were given to 7 students, most of whom will be teachers. Sian, abandoned by her parents when she became an Adventist, has no financial support. She is a gentle person who motivates and loves children.

She is an excellent student, but financing her education this year is a challenge. During her first two years of college, she received some financial help from her parents, but now they are unable to help. With a GC Women's Ministries scholarship she can continue preparing to serve.

The talented violinist and equally passionate theology student will use the funds to continue her studies at Bogenhofen Theological Seminary in Austria, where her professors describe her as reliable, determined and focused, one of the department's best students, a "keen thinker" with a reputation for turning in quality work in a timely manner.

Concerts as Outreach

Luise, a former atheist who embraced Adventism just over a decade ago, says the

difference Christ has made in her life, coupled with her background, enables her to relate to secular young people. She's actively involved in community outreach, leading Bible studies and organizing concerts for young people. Luise's contributions, whether



musical or work-related, are always spiritual, says the seminary president.

Orchestra Leader

Luise also maintains an ambitious work schedule. She teaches violin and music theory, and leads the orchestra at Bogenhofen. She also assists in the library and the Ellen White Center, teaches music and religion at the elementary school, and serves as assistant dorm dean. At church, she organizes music programs, preaches, and teaches Sabbath School. She also edits *Salvation and Service*, a magazine targeting German young people. Luise is an outstanding example of the caliber of women our scholarship program helps.
