This January, WM scholarships helped 76 women—bright, dedicated women

such as Ekaterina at Zaoksky Adventist University, Russia, who often visits orphanages because she remembers her years spent in one. A gifted violinist, she calls her talent "a gift from God." But without our help, she can't finish college.




