university student didn't let a diagnosis of Juvenile Rheumatoid Arthritis slow her down. She is studying Nutrition and Public Health at the Seventh-day Adventist university in

her native Lima, Peru. Claudia also financially supports her mother, who is ill, and six younger siblings because their father passed away.

Putting her family's wellbeing first leaves Claudia with little money for her education. Every other semester she leaves school to do literature evangelism to pay for school, greatly slowing her progress. Now, with just one semester between her and graduation, Claudia knows a Woman's Ministries scholarship will help her reach her goal.

Claudia is active in Children's and Women's Ministries, and also gives vegetarian cooking workshops in the community.

"Shall I speak to you in Tamazight, French, Arabic—or in English, which I'm just learning? I am Esther, newly married to a pioneer pastor. I hope to finish my studies in biology. My husband encourages me, but funds are low, and it is hard for women to attend college.

but I missed something. After starting to study the Bible deeply, I found peace. Now as God's daughter, I tell others, without forgetting to invite them to be sons and daughters of God."

While reading scholarship applications from around the globe, members of the GC Women's Ministries Scholarship Committee hear our sisters pleading for the opportunity to get an education. These women, often already leaders in their schools and churches, want to study in order to best serve God and their communities.

This August, the Scholarship Committee helped 57 women, from 22 countries, awarding a total of \$33,900. Added to awards from January, this year's scholarships total \$73,900, and helped 132 women.

Tatiana is a senior currently studying in Freiburg, Germany, but receives no financial support from her mother who gets a pension of only 50 euros.

Tatiana shares her beliefs openly with friends and study colleagues. She is a deacon in her church and presented a seminar on several world religions. With her language skills, she tutors Arabic and Turkish language classes. A former professor says, "She was a talented and enthusiastic student....I sincerely regret not having her in my classes any more."
