SUPPORTING HIGHER EDUCATION FOR ADVENTIST WOMEN GLOBALLY

Sisters in 26 Countries

YOU NOW HAVE sisters in Tonga and Kazahkstan. For the first time, women from these countries are among the **68** women, from 26 countries, awarded **\$45,650** in GC Women's Ministries Scholarships this February.

YOUR DOLLARS HELP outstanding Adventist women who are committed to serving their church and their community, women such as

- Felekech, a Public Health major from Ethiopia, is married with three children. Active in Women's Ministries, she is "respected and loved, with fine leadership skills."
- Careen, from Kenya, started university in 2007 but finances held her back. Teachers say, "Her



persistence is inspiring." People oriented, she is a deaconess, youth leader, and Sabbath school teacher.

- Simona, from Romania, is "inspirational, a born leader, and a good influence, helping people change and discover the value of life in God."
- Antonette, from Jamaica, after struggling for 12 years to finish

college, has one semester to go. A strong spiritual leader, she participates in prayer team, outreach activities, Women's Ministries, and Sabbath school.

TOGETHER WE HELPED 68 women. Yet many others who are equally gifted and dedicated were turned down because scholarship money ran out. Their churches and communities need their skills, service, and leadership. Let's help more of our sisters.



If you missed "Songs for My Sisters," the **first annual concert** to benefit the Women's Scholarship Program, you missed some fantastic music.

Performances by soprano Laura Morena, duo-pianists Jemuel and Donna Maria Anderson, and the Washington Brazilian Youth Choir filled the Brazilian SDA Temple in Fulton, MD, with soaring hymns and songs of praise.

The **December concert** raised nearly \$5,000 in pledges and donations for the Women's Scholarship fund, which assists Adventist women in college around the world.

Lavonne feels a strong call to help others struggling with the scars of abuse. She believes her training will help her heal broken spirits by introducing clients to the hope she found in Jesus. In the meantime, she is impacting those around her. Active in her church, school and community, she is a deaconess, campus ministries leader, choir member and participant in community outreach.

Her professors describe her as a "born leader," diligent and motivated, with integrity and compassion. "If given the opportunity, she will become a powerhouse for good," her pastor says.

A scholarship from GC Women's Ministries is part of that opportunity. "God has opened amazing doors for me," she says. "I know He will continue."
