says, "I was not sure about all that Christians claim Jesus can do. After hearing the Adventist message from a certain gentleman, I decided to wait a year to observe his lifestyle. [I saw that] even amidst toil he had a calm spirit and trusted in Christ." Cut off when she was baptized, Efosa receives no help from her family. On Sundays she "does manual laundry for people" to help with tuition, which is **US\$295** per year.

# A DYNAMO WITH empathy?

# "Miss Jynamo" might be

a good name for Hoi Lam, who is studying physiotherapy in Hong Kong. Active at church, she led the band, teaches a teen Sabbath school class, and is Youth Ministries leader where she "facilitates Sabbath afternoon fellowship to promote church bonding and spiritual growth in youth."

**At school** she serves with the Orientation Camp for incoming physiotherapy students, "listening to their struggles, confusion and excitement in their new environment, encouraging and advising them."

**She also volunteers** with immigrant orientation for newcomers to Hong Kong, and during the pandemic she distributed epidemic care packs to the homeless.

#### TO BE A MIRROR

An excellent student, she chose to study physiotherapy "because I wish to extend the healing ministry of Christ, delivering God's love and truth by serving the needy. [When I begin my career] I will treat my patients with love as a mirror reflecting Christ."

Hoi Lam admits she has not always been close to Christ. "I was a rebellious girl, a second-generation Adventist, with no real relationship with God. Thankfully, I slowly learned to trust Him. One special experience was when I was choosing electives in Form 3. I wanted to take Biology, Chemistry and Physics, but feared I could not handle it. I prayed for guidance and found it in a song saying that Moses had to step with faith into the Red Sea before the water parted. I knew God would make a way for me if I stepped forth in trust. God became real to me."

#### **NOW I SEE**

Now "I share my testimony with my friends to strengthen their faith.... I now see other people with empathy. Although they may be rebellious or arrogant—as I used to be—they have the potential to be faithful disciples of Jesus." I have learned "to treat people with care so they can be touched by the love of Christ."
